

FOOD LICENSE EXEMPTION STATEMENT

(Idaho Code 39-1602)

[FOOD CODE 1-201.10 (36) (c)]

A. FOOD LICENSE IS NOT REQUIRED IN IDAHO FOR THE FOLLOWING:

1. Private homes where food is prepared or served for individual family consumption.
2. Fraternal, benevolent, or non-profit charitable organizations which do not serve:
 - a. Non-potentially Hazardous Food (NPHF) more than five (5) consecutive days on no more than three occasions per year, or
 - b. All other foods more than one (1) meal a week.
3. Bed & breakfast establishments with 10 or fewer beds.
4. An establishment offering only prepackaged FOODS that are not POTENTIALLY HAZARDOUS.
5. Agricultural markets and agricultural equipment.
6. A produce stand that only offers whole, uncut fresh fruits and vegetables.
7. Low-risk food establishments which offer only factory-sealed NPHF not sold to licensed food establishments and not advertised.
8. Licensed Outfitter/Guide and similar operations for which:
 - a. A special activity is the main attraction;
 - b. Food is incidental to the main attraction;
 - c. Admission is by advance reservation; and,
 - d. The activity is not available to walk-in customers.
9. Day care providers.
10. Establishments licensed by other agencies.

B. EASTERN IDAHO PUBLIC HEALTH - FOOD LICENSE EXEMPTION

The following categories are exempt and not required to have a food license:

1. All groups or clubs (for example civic, church, educational, Kiwanis, Rotary, Girl/Boy Scouts, cheerleaders, neighborhoods, etc.) that do not operate as a normal food establishment business and who are operating in a manner such as a fraternal, benevolent, charitable or non-profit organization.
2. Individuals or businesses who prepare and serve food for a charitable cause or event, if that event is limited to one day per week and the CONSUMER is informed by a clearly visible placard at the sales or service location that the FOOD is prepared in a kitchen that is not subject to regulation and inspected by a REGULATORY AUTHORITY. Foods allowed to be served would be limited only to those foods considered "MEDIUM-RISK."
3. Businesses that are providing food as part of a promotional event if the event is held at the business location and the CONSUMER is informed by a clearly visible placard at the sales or service location that the FOOD is prepared in a kitchen that is not subject to regulation and inspected by a REGULATORY AUTHORITY. Foods allowed to be served would be limited only to those foods considered "MEDIUM-RISK."
