




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Licensure of Temporary and Intermittent Food Vendor Guidance

This document is being provided to assist both Eastern Idaho Public Health District Environmental Health Staff and Temporary Food License holders understand regulation changes for food vendors. This policy is effective as of July 1, 2009.

License Fee - \$ 65.00

- ◆ **One Fee will cover the temporary or intermittent food establishment for an entire calendar year.**
Valid: Throughout the entire state if the same menu is served for each event.
If the menu is changed, a new application and fee is required.
The food license must be on display at each event.

- ◆ **If a vendor plans to operate in multiple health districts, the vendor must obtain a separate license in each district; however, a separate fee will not be required.**
Valid: Proof a food license has been paid for at another district (copy of license and/or receipt).
Proof that the same menu is being served at the event(s) planned in the new district.

If this information cannot be provided at time of application, a new license and fee will be required.



- ◆ **A license issued to a temporary or intermittent food establishment is valid for multiple events in the district where it is obtained, as long as the same menu is served and the license issued to the vendor has the following information:**
 - The listing of all events planned to attend.
 - The length/dates of the events.
- ◆ **Any restrictions associated with the temporary and/or intermittent food events must be followed.**
- ◆ **The temporary or intermittent food establishment may not be inspected at each event, but the Health District may still inspect at any time the establishment is operating. Some instances may include:**
 - Previous violations noted on past inspection.
 - Operating at a multiple day event.
 - Setting up at a booth operating in different seasons or with large temperature changes.
